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CERTIFICATE INFORMATION

It is the policy of the OCWTP that participants receive credit for training only if they attend a workshop in its entirety and complete an evaluation form at the conclusion of the workshop. **Any participant who misses more than 15 total minutes of a workshop, whether for personal or professional reasons, cannot receive a certificate for that training.** In order to receive a certificate, a participant must attend the entire training session – no exceptions. Sessions will start on time, so please be prompt for all trainings.

If a workshop has two sessions and you are unable to attend the first, you may not attend the second session.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO MAXIMIZE YOUR TRAINING BENEFITS

1. In order for class to start promptly, please arrive at the training site at least 10 minutes before the workshop is scheduled to begin to sign in and get settled, and return promptly from lunch and breaks.
2. Turn all mechanical devices, such as cellular phones and pagers, to silent or vibrate mode.
3. Screen calls during class time. Return calls during breaks or lunch.
4. Be sensitive to the training needs of others. Talking during a presentation is disruptive to others and also prevents you from learning valuable information.
5. **Come prepared to learn!** Research indicates that people remember 20% of what they hear, 30% of what they see, 70% of what they say, and 90% of what they do – **Participate actively!**
6. Plan how you will use the information you learn in your daily interactions with foster children and staff (Transfer of Learning).
7. Assist the trainer and the RTC by thoroughly completing an evaluation of the training and by picking up any debris in your area.

TRAINER BIOGRAPHIES

Lynne Anderson, BA – Ms. Anderson is an adoptive parent and a former foster mother. She has a special interest in family dynamics and the relationships that affect family members. Ms. Anderson has worked as a caseworker with teenagers, served as director of a senior center, and worked on the development and coordination of social services in the greater Cincinnati area.

Judith Qualls – Ms. Qualls and her husband have four adult birth children, four adopted children, and have been providing treatment foster care to teenagers since 1995. She enjoys mentoring foster parents and began co-training prospective foster and adoptive parents in 1999 and became an approved OCWTP trainer in 2002.



PRESERVICE MODULES

MODULE I: ORIENTATION TO FOSTER CARE, ADOPTION, AND KINSHIP CARE (901-PS1A-S)

Module I of Preservice training provides an overview of the child welfare system and examines the differences between foster care, adoption, and kinship care. Participants receive information about the needs of waiting children as well as the process of becoming a foster or kinship caregiver or adoptive parent. CEUs are not provided for this three-hour training.

Module II: The Child Protection Team (902-PS2A-S)

Module II of Preservice training discusses the history and goals of foster and kinship care and adoption and examines the role of foster and kinship caregivers and adoptive parents within the system. Emphasis is placed on the primary care team: the child, the foster or kinship caregiver or adoptive parent, the primary parent, and the agency caseworker. Participants become aware of strategies to use teams effectively to serve children and families. CEUs are not provided for this three-hour training.

Module III: Child Development (903-PS3A-S)

Module III of Preservice training introduces the core concepts of early childhood development. Participants receive an overview of brain development and gain an awareness of the importance of attachment, self-regulation and initiative to child development. Factors that enhance development are also addressed. CEUs are not provided for this three-hour training.

Module IV: Trauma and Its Effects (903-PS4-S)

Module IV of Preservice training helps participants understand how childhood trauma can effect development, including brain development, as well as emotions and behavior. CEUs are not provided for this three-hour training.

Module V: Child Sexual Abuse (903-PS5-S)

Module V of Preservice training provides an overview of child sexual abuse and is designed to help prospective caregivers and adoptive parents understand basic facts about child sexual abuse, recognize potential indicators of sexual abuse, and take beginning steps to make their homes safe environments for children who have been sexually abused.

Module VI: Minimizing the Trauma of Placement (904-PS6-S)

Module VI of Preservice training addresses strategies caregivers and adoptive parents can use to help the child feel safe and accepted in their home and community. The importance of maintaining connections is stressed.

Module VII: Transcending Differences in Placement (907-PS7A-S)

Module VII of Preservice training helps participants gain awareness of their own diversity in order to better understand the diversity of each child that comes to their home. Participants will consider ways they can prepare their home and community to welcome and provide a safe and nurturing environment for a child.

Module VIII: Helping the Child Manage Emotions and Behaviors (905-PS8A-S)

Module VIII of Preservice introduces caregivers and adoptive parents to strategies they can use to assist children in learning to manage their emotions and control their behaviors.

Module IX: Understanding Primary Families (908-PS9A-S)

Module IX of Preservice presents a rationale for involvement of foster caregivers in promoting connections to primary family members, particularly primary parents and siblings. The training encourages a non-judgmental approach to the caregiver's work with primary families to promote reunification.

Module X: The Effects of Caregiving on the Caregiver Family (906-PS10A-S)

Module X of Preservice training examines the impact of foster care, kinship care and adoption on individual members of the caregiving family, as well as the impact on their relationships with one another. Participants are introduced to effective coping strategies to prevent against burnout and secondary traumatic stress.

Module XI: Long-Term Separation (909-PS11A-S)

Module XI of Preservice training describes the emotions children and youth experience when reunification efforts with the birth parents fail. Feelings of adopted children or children in long-term substitute care placements are explored. Participants will learn about typical triggers of long-term grief. Finally, the personal perspectives of adopted individuals will be shared.

Module XII: Post Adoption Issues for Families (909-PS12A-S)

Module XII of Preservice training describes the adoption dynamics impacting families. Openness in adoption will be addressed as well as stages of adjustment for new adoptive families. Participants will learn about post-adoption services including subsidy.

Go two blocks, and turn right onto North Union Street. Delaware County DJFS is a three-story brick building on the left.

From the West: Take I-70 East to I-270 North, and travel on I-270 to US-23 North. Continue on US-23 and take the US-36/West William Street exit. Turn left onto West William Street. Go two blocks, and turn right onto North Union Street. Delaware County DJFS is a three-story brick building on the left.
