Trainer Event

The 2008 Trainer Event, "Permanency: Making the Connection" will be held on March 3 at the Crown Plaza Hotel in Columbus (same location as last year, new hotel management). Attendees will hear directly from youth about their child welfare experiences. The OCWTP wants to help all trainers see their role in securing permanency for children. Classroom Performance System

IMPORTANT, IF YOU USE THE CPS SYSTEM IN YOUR TRAINING:

Einstruction, the manufacturer of CPS wireless remote technology, has released a new version of its free CPS software (version 5.01) that is now available for download and installation through their website at www.einstruction.com. The new version is the **only version compatible with the Windows Vista operating system** and it is now the only Windows version available for download on their website.

The OCWTP will not be using the new version (meaning all RTCs and IHS will not be load the new version on their laptops) until late September/early October, in order to allow RTCs time to become familiar with the new software so they can provide technical support to trainers.

Having said that, we appreciate that some trainers may have new laptops with Vista installed, or may just want to experiment with the new software on their own. Here is what you need to be aware of before doing so:

- The new software, while performing essentially the same functions, has a considerably different look than the old software, which may be somewhat confusing to those of you comfortable with the old software. With minimal assistance, you will see that the new software isn't any harder to use than the old software (and may even seem easier once you get over the differences in the user interface).
- When you download and install the new software on a desktop or laptop, it automatically replaces the old software on that computer (so you cannot be running both the old version and the new version on the same PC). Further, once you open an old CPS database from within the new software, it automatically converts the old database and you cannot convert it back for use within the old software on another PC.
- All RTC laptops will continue to use only the old CPS software until the program moves as a whole to the new software in late September/early October. You can only use the new software in training before then if you bring your own laptop and Core CPS/PowerPoint files to the training.
- RTCs and IHS can still provide you with the old software for you to install on any non-Vista equipment if you do not yet have the old software and would like to use it. Just email Tonya Herzog at IHS to receive a copy of the old software: therzog@ihs-trainet.com.

- The new software is considerably larger than the old software (90 MB versus 40 MB)--so it will take you some time to download, depending on the speed of your Internet connection.
- We have posted a revised version of the blue CPS User Manual on the OCWTP website that walks you through using the new version 5.01. Go to <http://www.ocwtp.net/Trainer%20Resources.html#CPS> to download the revised manual.

As we get closer to switching over as a program, we will be providing written training materials on the new software, along with regularly scheduled CPS TOTs for those who have never used CPS or who want more comprehensive CPS training. We will also be providing WebEx and teleconferencing support, as needed, for trainers who only need assistance going from the old software to the new software. Learning Management System (LMS)

According to our technology staff, intense training will not be necessary for trainers to learn how to navigate the NEW LMS, currently being constructed for the OCWTP.
